PURPOSE OF COURSE: Jesus commissioned His followers to 'go, make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you...' (Matt. 28:19). This is the primary purpose of the Adventist Encounter Curriculum. Never has there been a greater time in our world's history to make this the focus of the Seventh-day Adventist church.

Ultimately, Encounter seeks to obey the Three Angel's Message of Revelation 14—a call for people to stand in these last days in a real relationship with God, to be aroused from their apathy and worship our Creator alone.

CONTENT DESCRIPTION: This course uncovers God's involvement in the development of His church in both Old and New Testament times. The history of the Seventh-day Adventist Church is also explored.

REQUIRED TOOLS FOR SUCCESS: Your Bible! Everyone must have their Bible in class every day! This is critical for success! We also need to pray for the Holy Spirit every day too. Of course you will need your brain! :) Besides these, please bring loose leaf paper, a writing utensil, and something to keep all your assignments organized. Please bring a red pen too!

Semester 2

We will pick up our study after the New Testament church with the history of the Christian Church from 70 A.D. to the present time, concluding with a study of the rise and development of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.
